Start Location:	Students are to be at the pool by 8:50am for Roll Call.
End Location:	Students will be dismissed from the venue at the conclusion of the activity.
Transport:	Students are to make their own way to and from the venue.
Dress Code:	<p>It is advised that your child/ward has appropriate clothing for the day, this includes a hat, sunglasses, t-shirt, and appropriate swimmers. Students are encouraged to bring sunscreen and a drink.</p> <p>Students are encouraged to wear House colours: Burke – Purple. Parkes – Green. Sturt – Red. Wills – Blue.</p>
Food:	Canteen facilities will be available. Students are not allowed to order or have parents/carers deliver take away food. If you do not wish to use the canteen facilities, students will be required to bring their own food and drinks.
Additional Information:	<p>The entry cost into the pool is paid by the school, as all students are expected to attend, as this is a whole school event.</p> <p>There will be novelty events for non-swimmers, fun inflatable relays and other activities, as well as competitive races. All students are encouraged to participate in either novelty or competitive events.</p> <p>No glass or crepe paper is to be brought to the pool.</p>

In case of cancellation, students will be advised prior and are expected to attend their regular timetabled lesson in full school uniform. Students must NOT bring expensive items as the school takes no responsibility for any potential theft or loss.

Important information

Personal injury statement In the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity. The Department's public liability cover is fault-based and limited to breaches by the Department of its duty of care to students that may result in claims for compensation.

Parents/Carers are advised to assess the level and extent of their child/ward's involvement in the sport program offered by the school, school sport zone, region and state school sport associations when deciding whether additional insurance cover is required prior to their child's involvement in the program.

Personal accident insurance cover is available through normal retail outlets. Parents/Carers who have private ambulance cover need to check whether that cover extends to interstate travel and make additional arrangements as considered appropriate. The NSW Supplementary Sporting Injury Benefits Scheme, funded by the NSW Government, provides limited cover for serious injury resulting in the permanent loss of a prescribed faculty or the loss of use of certain prescribed parts of the body. Concussion Clearance and Medical Treatment

The Australian Medical Association recommends students being symptom free of concussion for 14 days before returning to sport.
