BOOK REVIEW The Husband's Secret by Liane Moriarty

When someone living in suburban Sydney writes a novel that becomes a No. 1 *New York Times* bestseller, you just have to sit up and take notice.

After reading the first chapter of *The Husband's Secret* what immediately comes to mind is the short story by Somerset Maugham called *The Letter*. In the story by Maugham "the letter" contains a secret that the villainess doesn't want other people to know about.

In *The Husband's Secret*, however, Cecilia Fitzpatrick, loving mother and wife, successful businesswoman and adept in her social life, comes across a hidden envelope completely by accident. The envelope is sealed and yellowish in colour (suggesting age). On the cover of the envelope are written the disturbing words: *To be opened only in the event of my death. John-Paul Fitzpatrick*

What has Cecilia's husband written on the note inside the envelope? The reader, like the protagonist, is immediately intrigued. The husband is not dead yet, but is on an overseas business trip. What should our heroine do?

A bit later, John-Paul rings up from overseas. John-Paul is by all accounts, a loving husband and devoted father. However, Cecilia gets the impression that her husband is lying to her – something she has not knowingly experienced in her marriage before.

There are intertwining story lines involving the other main characters - Rachel, Tess and Connor - and, in this finely wrought short novel, the author cleverly ties it all together. That said, the *denouement* is staggering – is it about adultery or coming out or ...what? You have to sit down and read this novel to find out. Believe me, you won't begrudge the time spent.

This story starts out as an interesting look at modern marriage, but quickly turns into something quite different. Liane Moriarty is the hottest thing in Australian publishing today, and, after reading *The Husband's Secret*, you will understand why. Our own Nicole Kidman is thinking of optioning the novel to make it into a film; so, if all goes well, we could be in for a treat at the cinema next year.

Reason for Absence Notes

It is a legal requirement that if a child is absent for any reason then it must be explained in a signed note by the parent/caregiver.

The Home School Liaison Officer checks for notes to match absences and if absences are not accompanied by a note parents/caregivers may need to explain.

Certain procedures must be carried out when children are absent from school for **any** period of time including full day absence and partial absence (late arrival to school/early departure due to appointments or sickness etc.)

The school has provided a 'REASON FOR ABSENCE' note to assist you to notify the school when your child is absent or late. More notes are available from the Front Office if required.
